Requirements for admission of International Students

Complete the International Student Application.
 Applicants must submit copies of all secondary credentials (equivalent to U.S. High School diploma or GED). If you are interested in transferring credit from a non-U.S. college/university, you must submit an official translated transcript. These can be obtained through: World Education Services (WES) or Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE).
 Submit proof of English proficiency through official test results from one of these sources: Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). A score of 526 or above is required (Or a score of 194 on the computer-based test; or 80 on the Internet Based Test with scores no lower than 20 each on the reading, writing, speaking and listening portion of the tests.)
 International English Language Testing System (IELTS). A score of 5.5 or above is required.
 <u>Duolingo English Test (DET)</u>. A score of 95 or above is required.
 Students Exempt from Testing You are not required to submit proof of English proficiency if you have completed one full academic year at a high school, college or university in the U.S. as a full-time student (without any ESL classes), or earned an accredited bachelor's, master's or doctoral degree in the U.S.
Submit a copy of your current passport photo ID page.
Submit a bank statement dated no more than six months from the start of the semester you are planning to attend to indicate the ability to cover all educational expenses. Estimated cost of expenses per year is \$27,000. If you have a financial sponsor, the bank statement should be in their name.
Along with the requirements listed above, if you are a transfer student , you must also: • Request official transcripts from your previous institution to be sent directly to MCC.
 Submit copies of your current: I-20 form F-1 visa I-94
 Complete and submit an <u>International Transfer Verification form</u> if transferring from another college or university.
When all the required information has been received and evaluated, an acceptance letter and approved I-20 form will be issued by Montcalm Community College. This process can take up to a month from the time that all requirements are submitted.
